Monetta Ann Hill – age 76, Golden Age Nursing Home in Greenwood

Mrs. Monetta Ann Hill was born in 1942 in New Orleans, Louisiana. She moved to Greenwood, Mississippi in the late 1940s. She was educated in the nearby communities of Winona, Kilmichael and Duck Hill, and also in Greenwood.

As her education progressed, she graduated from Broad Street High School. Following high school, she worked as a field secretary for the Greenwood Southern Christian Leadership Conference where she was involved in several civil rights engagement activities such as the Greenwood Voter Registration Campaign.

She also worked and served in many capacities at the Mississippi Head Start Center and later went to nursing school at Mississippi Valley State College where she graduated in 1969 as a registered nurse.



Following nursing school, she worked as a charge nurse at Golden Age Nursing Home from 1984-1998. Upon retirement, she spent several years serving as the primary caregiver for several of her grandchildren until she transitioned to Golden Age Nursing Home as a resident.

Mrs. Hill is known for mentoring others in the

community and opening her home to assist others in need. She is the mother of one daughter and four sons, and was always very active in supporting her children, especially in their school endeavors where she was a band booster and football booster.

She has 20 grandchildren, more than 30 great grandchildren, and is a lifelong member of McKinney Chapel M.B. Baptist Church. Her life has been dedicated to her family, her community and serving others as a nurse—a true calling of a servant's heart that's demonstrated well by the enriched life of Mrs. Monetta Hill.
